**TIP:** Take the bite registration and shade before numbing patient.

**REASON:** This technique will give the Lab the best accuracy. The shade is more accurate when patient hydrated.

**TIP:** Use a metal or stiff tray for the impression. **REASON:** If the tray can be flexed by light pressure, then the impression will be distorted after material has set.

**TIP:** The Assistant should load the tray at the same time the Dentist is injecting around the prep. **REASON:** If the medium/heavy body material is

loaded too early then it will become rigid and force the wash material away from the margin.

**TIP:** When seating the tray, use a slow, steady and vertical motion.

**REASON:** Drags can occur when the tray is placed too quickly. Pulls can occur when teeth rebound off of the tray.

**TIP:** Manufacturers instructions for set time must be followed. Add one minute for guaranteed results. **REASON:** The extra time will allow margins to completely set.

TIP: Use tray adhesive on all trays.

Including those with holes.

ASON: With adhesive, polymerization shrinkage

**REASON:** With adhesive, polymerization shrinkage is consistent instead of towards the mass.



**TIP:** Don't let the patient hold the tray. **REASON:** Firm, consistent pressure is required to prevent distortion.



**TIP:** Check the expiration date. **REASON:** Expired material will not set properly.



TIP: Keep the mixing tip completely submerged in the material while filling the tray.

REASON: Air bubbles will form if not completely submerged leaving voids.

TIP: Use a full tray if there are no posterior stops.

REASON: An accurate bite cannot be established if insufficient occlusion is captured.
